

WHAT IS A SEED LIBRARY?

A seed library is not only a collection of seeds and resource for growing flowers and produce, but it is also a great way to connect community members, gardeners, and create a shared experience while promoting gardening among area residents.

Our Seed Library will include open-pollinated or heirloom vegetable, fruit and flower seeds. Each participant can choose up to five seed packets per season at no charge and it is open to all. We are accepting monetary donations to replenish our supply at first, since we realize not everyone will have a successful crop and be able to return seeds the first time out. Eventually, we hope to have enough seeds from those harvested and returned to the library that our seed library will be self-sustaining.

HARVEST & SHARE

When you harvest, save some seeds for you and some for the library. Fill out a Seed Library Donation form for each seed variety and return it along with seeds to the WLCL for next year's Seed Library.

WLCL's Seed Library does not accept hybrid seeds.

HOW IT WORKS AT WLCL

Select your seeds and sign them out, plant your garden, and tend your plants. During harvest time, save seeds from your plants for your next garden and return some seeds to the WLCL Seed Library for others to enjoy.
